What local food should visitors try in Apulia?

One of our traditional dishes is "orecchiette alle cime di rapa" which is a special sort of pasta together with vegetables similar to broccoli. Visitors shouldn't miss a tasty local vine like Negroamaro or Primitivo, which are famous in the region of Salento.

What is the best experience in your region that no visitor should miss?
