## Which beach or cultural spot would you recommend in your destination Cyprus?

Kykkos Monastery is the wealthiest and most lavish religious institute on the island, situated in the Troodos Mountains. Personally, I prefer the villages where you step back in time and experience the real and authentic Cyprus. But you can also relax on one of the local cruises during summer, which take you to some of Cyprus' best beaches like Blue Lagoon or Cape Greko.

## What local food should visitors try in Cyprus?

Cyprus is a heaven for any food lover. The best way to sample all the local dishes is trying a Meze, a selection of small dishes which can include fried vegetables, eggplant salad and different kinds of cheese. Locals tend to drink brandy, but there is also a good choice of local wines and beer. Don't forget to try the sweet dessert wine "Commandaria" or the firewater "Zivania".

## What is the best experience in your region that no visitor should miss?
